GOSPEL READING

Lk 11:1-13



Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

My dear parishioners,

Here are some of Fr. Tom scattered thoughts...

“How do I pray ?” Is the frequently asked question. It was also a question the disciples asked Jesus.

What place does prayer have in my own life?
What does the Gospel say about the prayer?
What does Jesus say about prayer?

On this 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings draw our attention to need to pray. We need to always turn to God in prayer in all circumstance of life. We are reminded of the importance of prayer—pray at all times!
Today, in the Gospel, Jesus gives us the key to success. He teaches us how to pray as well as encourages us to pray unceasingly.

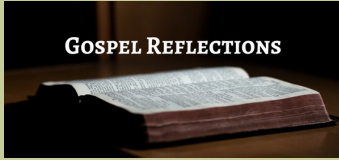
There are 4 types of prayer in the Gospel—ACTS.

A—Adoration. In the prayer of adoration, we recognize that God is God.
C—In the prayer of contrition, we recognize that we are sinners in need of God’s mercy.
T—Thanksgiving, in this prayer of thanksgiving, we recognize God’s many gift to us.
S— Supplication, in this prayer of supplication ,we acknowledge to God’s help ... Jesus teaches his disciples “Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you.”

Jesus begins his ministry always with prayer and ends it with prayer:
Our God never goes to sleep. He knows when, where and how to respond. Therefore, we must not give up or get tired of the habit of praying and interceding for one another because prayer unlocks the heart of God and brings the power of heaven to earth. Pray for the grace of perseverance in prayer.

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS



Luke gives more attention to Jesus' teachings on prayer than any other Gospel writer. He also mentions Jesus at prayer more than the others. In today's reading, from the beginning of Chapter 11 of his Gospel, Luke presents the core of Jesus' teaching on prayer. It consists of Jesus teaching a prayer to his disciples, a parable on the persistent neighbor, and assurances that God hears our prayers.

The disciples notice Jesus praying "in a certain place." They ask him to teach them to pray just as John the Baptist had taught his disciples. Jesus teaches them a simple version of the most famous Christian prayer, the Our Father, or the Lord's Prayer. Matthew's version shows signs of being shaped by public prayer. Luke's version is probably closer to the original form that Jesus taught. Stripped of much of the language we are used to, Luke's version seems simple and direct. We pray that God's name will be recognized as holy and that his rule over all will be established. This is followed by petitions for our needs for bread, for forgiveness, and for deliverance. Luke uses the more theological language of "sins" rather than "debts," which is used in Matthew's version.

Having taught his disciples a simple, daily prayer, Jesus goes on to reassure them that God answers prayers. First he tells a parable about a persistent neighbor who asks a friend for bread at midnight. The friend is already in bed and has no desire to disturb his family by opening the door. But because the neighbor is persistent, the sleeping man gets up and gives him all that he needs. If a neighbor is willing to help us if we are persistent enough, how could God not respond to our requests?

This teaching concludes with the reminder that if we seek, we will get a response. If a human father, with all his faults, knows how to give good gifts to his children, how much more will our heavenly Father give us? Instead of good gifts, however, Luke substitutes the word Holy Spirit. This foreshadows the gift of the Holy Spirit, who is central to Luke's theology and who will play an important role in the growth of the early Church after Pentecost.

The parable and the concluding teaching in this section should not lead us to think of prayer as a series of requests presented to God. Rather, as Jesus teaches in his model prayer, prayer consists in recognizing God's holiness and his rule over all things.

BLESSED ANTONIO LUCCI

FEAST DAY: JULY 27



S saint of the day

Antonio studied with and was a friend of Saint Francesco Antonio Fasani, who after Antonio Lucci's death, testified at the diocesan hearings regarding the holiness of Lucci.

Born in Agnone in southern Italy, a city famous for manufacturing bells and copper crafts, he was given the name Angelo at baptism. He attended the local school run by the Conventual Franciscans and joined them at the age of 16. Antonio completed his studies for the priesthood in Assisi, where he was ordained in 1705. Further studies led to a doctorate in theology and appointments as a teacher in Agnone, Ravello, and Naples. He also served as guardian in Naples. Elected minister provincial in 1718, the following year he was appointed professor at St. Bonaventure College in Rome, a position he held until Pope Benedict XIII chose Antonio as bishop of Bovino in 1729. The pope explained, "I have chosen as bishop of Bovino an eminent theologian and a great saint." His 23 years as bishop were marked by visits to local parishes and a renewal of gospel living among the people of his diocese. He dedicated his episcopal income to works of education and charity. At the urging of the Conventual minister general, Bishop Lucci wrote a major book about the saints and blessed in the first 200 years of the Conventual Franciscans. Antonio Lucci was beatified in 1989, three years after his friend Francesco Antonio Fasani was canonized. His liturgical feast is celebrated on July 25.

Reflection

As Pope Paul VI wrote in 1975, people today "are more impressed by witnesses than by teachers, and if they listen to these it is because they also bear witness" (Evangelization in the Modern World, #41).
