A note From the pastor

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

08/14/2022

My dear parishioners,

Here are some more of my scattered thoughts...

Our 60th Anniversary Festival is just around the corner. This is a time we, as a parish, pause to thank God for many blessings He has abestowed upon us. Let us be here together to celebrate this day on Sunday, August 21st at 11:00 am.

"Feed my lambs, feed my sheep" is the title of the 2022 Bishop's Ministries Appeal. This is a yearly appeal that assists our diocese in supporting a variety of ministries, services and programs that benefit many throughtout the East Bay. On behalf of our Bishop Barber, I thank you for your support to this appeal. We haven's reached our goal of \$19,600 yet! We are at 70% of our goal: \$13,635. I do hope, we, togerther as a parish, do our best to reach the goal this year. Today's Gospel reminds us that accepting to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ is going to cost us something. What is our Faith worth? Commitment to Jesus forces us to change the way we live out lives and this can put strains on relationships. Commitment of faith requires us to change our attitude towards material possessions and to take even more seriously our moral resposibilities. If we commit to Christ we will find it affects the way we relate to friends and family members.

Something to wonder and share with Jesus:

What divisions have I found in my family, friendships and at work?

When I follow the will of God in my life, what happens?

What do these divisions make me think about?

What kind of commitment do you have for Jesus?

Having reminded the apostles and the crowd that facing the coming judgment takes patience, Jesus now goes on to speak of how difficult it will be to wait. He tells them that he has come to set the earth on fire. Recall that in chapter 3 of Luke's Gospel, John the Baptist tells the crowd that he is baptizing with water, but someone mightier is coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. The fire Jesus speaks of here is the distress caused by the coming judgment. It is also the fire of the Spirit that Luke, in the Acts of the Apostles, will describe descending on the disciples on Pentecost. That fire will strengthen them to go out to the whole world to preach the good news of Jesus' Resurrection.

Jesus will be the first to experience the distress of the coming judgment. His baptism will be the conflict into which he will be immersed as he approaches Jerusalem and his death on the cross. His followers will not be spared that distress. The angels at Jesus' birth proclaimed peace on earth, and Simeon, holding the baby Jesus in the Temple, said to God: "Master, now you may let your servant go in peace." Here Jesus tells the crowd not to think he has come to bring peace; he has come to bring division. Simeon said as much when he turned to Mary and said that the child was destined for the rise and fall of many and to be a sign that will be contradicted. Peace is the ultimate end of the Kingdom of God, but peace has a price. Jesus is warning the crowd that wherever the Word of God is heard and acted upon, division occurs. Fathers will be divided against sons and mothers against daughters.

The coming judgment forces us to look at the implications of our commitments. As Jesus warned in last Sunday's Gospel, a commitment of faith requires us to change our attitude toward material possessions and to take even more seriously our moral responsibilities. Here he reminds the crowd that those who commit to him will find it affects the way they relate to friends and family members. The angel who announced the birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah said John would go before Jesus to turn the hearts of fathers toward their children. But a commitment to Jesus forces us to change the way we live our lives, and this can put strains on relationships.

We don't expect to hear such difficult words from Jesus in the Gospel. But it is good to be reminded once in a while that the decision to do the right thing, the good thing, is not always easy and without conflict. Jesus himself did not make easy decisions and avoid conflict. In today's reading, he reminds his followers to be prepared for difficult decisions and conflict as well.

SAINT JOAN OF THE CROSS

FEAST DAY: AUGUST 17



An encounter with a shabby old woman many dismissed as insane prompted Saint Joan to dedicate her life to the poor. For Joan, who had a reputation as a businesswoman intent on monetary success, this was a significant conversion.

Born in 1666, in Anjou, France, Joan worked in the family business—a small shop near a religious shrine—from an early age. After her parents' death she took over the shop. She quickly became known for her greediness and insensitivity to the beggars who often came seeking help.

That was until she was touched by the strange woman who claimed she was on intimate terms with the deity. Joan, who had always been devout, even scrupulous, became a new person. She began caring for needy children. Then the poor, elderly, and sick came to her. Over time, she closed the family business so she could devote herself fully to good works and penance.

She went on to found what came to be known as the Congregation of Saint Anne of Providence. It was then she took the religious name of Joan of the Cross. By the time of her death in 1736 she had founded 12 religious houses, hospices, and schools. Pope John Paul II canonized her in 1982.

Reflection

The downtown areas of most major cities hold a population of "street people." Well-dressed folks usually avoid making eye contact, probably for fear of being asked for a handout. That was Joan's attitude until the day one of them touched her heart. Most people thought the old woman was crazy, but she put Joan on the road to sainthood. Who knows what the next beggar we meet might do for us?


