Mt 25: 31-46

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him,

he will sit upon his glorious throne,

and all the nations will be assembled before him.

And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left

Then the king will say to those on his right,

'Come, you who are blessed by my Father.

Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

For I was hungry and you gave me food,

I was thirsty and you gave me drink,

a stranger and you welcomed me,

naked and you clothed me,

ill and you cared for me,

in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him and say,

'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink?

When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?

When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?'

And the king will say to them in reply,

'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did

for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left,

'Depart from me, you accursed,

into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels.

For I was hungry and you gave me no food,

I was thirsty and you gave me no drink,

a stranger and you gave me no welcome,

naked and you gave me no clothing,

ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.'

Then they will answer and say,

'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison,

and not minister to your needs?'

He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you,

what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."



SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE 11/26/2023

Here are Father Tom's scattered thoughts...

My Dear OLQW Parish family,

- 1) Our Advent Communal Penance Service will be held on Monday, December 4, 2023 at 7:00 pm. There will be several priests available for individual confessions and absolution in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. Please come to prepare for Christ's coming.
- 2) Our Mass of Anointing of the Sick and Healing will be on Saturday, December 9 2023 at 10:00 am.
- 3) This Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year. On this Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. This Solemnity offers us the opportunity to reflect on the Kingdom that Christ came to establish. As the Church's year comes to an end, it also reminds us that the cycle of our own lives here on earth will come to its completion as well. The Gospel points out really forcibly that our works of mercy—especially for the needy among us—will open the doors of the eternal home for us. God is going to judge us on the works of mercy we perform daily in response to human need. We will be assured of a place in the Kingdom of Christ only if we treat others as Christ treats them. At the end of life, we shall be judged upon the love we have shown and the small acts of mercy we have performed. This Gospel of Christ the King is a challenging one and an exceptional importance as it portrays a powerful image of judgement. Whatever good or evil we do to others is done to Him. May Christ always be the King in our lives!

Heavenly Father, help us to show your goodness, warmth and kindness to all we meet so that when we are called to render an account of our lives, we may be found pleasing to you.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Today's Gospel passage is the conclusion of Jesus' discourse with his disciples. It is about the end of time, the coming of the Son of Man, and the final judgment. We hear this description of the final judgment at the conclusion of our liturgical year, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. In the context of Matthew's Gospel, this passage might also be read as a conclusion of Matthew's report on Jesus' life and ministry; the remaining chapters report the events of Jesus' Passion and Resurrection.

In today's Gospel, Jesus describes to his disciples the scene of the judgment of the Son of Man. All the nations will be assembled before him, and he will separate them as a shepherd separates sheep and goats upon their return from the pasture. The judgments made by the Son of Man will be based upon the acts of mercy shown to the least ones—the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. Indeed, Jesus, who suffered on the Cross, identifies himself with the least ones.

Recall that last week's parable of the talents taught us that the gifts that we have been given are intended to be used for the service of others, especially the least among us. Our judgment before God will be based not only on how we have used these gifts and talents, but also on how we have extended ourselves in service to these least ones. Indeed, Jesus tells us that whenever we have served these least ones, we have served Christ himself.

When we read today's Gospel in the context of the chapters that follow in Matthew's Gospel, we learn the extent to which Jesus identifies with the least ones. In accepting death on the cross, Jesus shows himself to be one of the hungry, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. To accept Jesus is to accept him who suffered and died on the Cross as one of the least ones.

The contact will look like it is from someone you go to church with. It may even appear to be from their email address or phone number.

The State Deputy for the Knights of Columbus email address was used recently to send similar scam emails. In the past some of our parishioners have been targeted using the email or phone number of our Clergy.

If you get an attempted scam email or text, please do not respond to it. Please let the real person know that you have received a scam communication.

It may be prudent to let the parish at large know that a scam is making the rounds.
