

Here are Father Tom's scattered thoughts for this Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday...

My Dear OLQW Parish family,

- 1. "Many Ministries One Church" is the title for 2024 Bishop's Ministries Appeal. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who have given to the Bishop's Appeal in the past, as well as those who also gave and continue to be generous to our parish, OLQW. This is a yearly appeal that assist the Bishop and our diocese is supporting a variety of ministries and programs that benefit many throughout the East Bay. We are still a few hundred dollars short to complete the 2023 of \$19,600. Our overall parish goal is still the same. Please be generous and help us reach our goal this year. - 2. Lent is well and truly over. We are really into the Easter season, celebrating Christ's victory over death, yet this weekend's readings call our attention necessity to repentance, conversion and to avoid sin, in order to share in the life of the Risen Christ, we must share in the life of the Crucified Christ. We must always keep this in mind... There is no Cross, there is no Crown. Death and resurrection must take place in the life of each of one of us. Sin separates us from the love of God we must die to self in order to live for God and only God alone. As Christians, at all costs, we must avoid sin.
- 3. We are all pilgrims on a journey. Two disciples on a journey to Emmaus speak to us personally how we are on our pilgrimage journey of faith. Like those two disciples, we might try to flee the city Jerusalem out of fear, from our faith and doubts...we focus on the past and are not ready for the future...we are stuck in past hurts and past fears...Our prayer today is to invite Jesus to come into our lives, so that our minds, our eyes and our hearts can be open to let God's words to touch our lives, to transform us...to be Christ's witness, preaching penance for the remission of sins, to all people. The resurrection cannot be limited to historical facts, to an event that happened to Jesus Christ over 2000 years ago...but it is a present reality who's light and warmth have touched and transformed peoples' lives. Resurrection must take place here and now in the life of every Christian. Don't be afraid to be Christ's witness...He is Risen...Alleluia, Alleluia.

On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel. Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives

as well. Peace is what they need more than anything

else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with

another gift—forgiveness. In today's Gospel, this con-

nection is made in the final verses. Even as they hear Jesus' greeting of peace, the disciples are startled and terrified. They are uncertain about what to make of the figure before them and, quite understandably, they mistake Jesus for a ghost. Yet the figure before them is not a ghost; Jesus invites them to experience his resurrected body with their senses, to look and to touch. The figure before them is flesh and bone, still bearing the marks of crucifixion. Although the disciples cannot forget his suffering and death, peace begins to take root in their hearts, as their fears turn to joy and amazement.

As further proof of his identity and of his resurrected body, Jesus eats with his disciples. The disciples have known Jesus best through the meals that he has shared with them. Descriptions of these meals are a defining element of Luke's Gospel. By eating with his disciples after his Resurrection, Jesus recalls all these meals, and most importantly, he recalls the Last Supper.

Luke's report of the Last Supper and the meals that Jesus shared after his Resurrection unveil for us the significance of the Eucharist. Having shared a meal with his disciples, Jesus now uncovers for them the significance of what was written about him in the Scriptures. So, too, our celebration of the Mass is an encounter with Jesus, through the Word and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. As Jesus commissions his disciples to be witnesses to what Scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us. Like the disciples, we are sent to announce the good news of Jesus' forgiveness of sins..

SAINT CAESAR DE BUS

Saint of the Day: April 15



Like so many of us, Caesar de Bus struggled with the decision about what to do with his life. After completing his Jesuit education he had difficulty settling between a military and a literary career. He wrote some plays but ultimately settled for life in the army and at court.

For a time, life was going rather smoothly for the engaging, well-to-do young Frenchman. He was confident he had made the right choice. That was until he saw firsthand the realities of battle, including the Saint Bartholomew's Day massacres of French Protestants in 1572.

He fell seriously ill and found himself reviewing his priorities, including his spiritual life. By the time he had recovered, Caesar had resolved to become a priest. Following his ordination in 1582, he undertook special pastoral work: teaching the catechism to ordinary people living in neglected, rural, out-of-the-way places. His efforts were badly needed and well received.

Working with his cousin, Caesar developed a program of family catechesis. The goal—to ward off heresy among the people—met the approval of local bishops. Out of these efforts grew a new religious congregation: the Fathers of Christian Doctrine.

One of Caesar's works, Instructions for the Family on the Four Parts of the Roman Catechism, was published 60 years after his death. He was beatified in 1975 and canonized in 2022.

Reflection

"Family catechesis" is a familiar term in parish life today. Grounded in the certainty that children learn their faith first from their parents, programs that deepen parental involvement in religious education multiply everywhere. There were no such programs in Caesar's day until he saw a need and created them. Other needs abound in our parishes, and it's up to us to respond by finding ways to fill them or by joining in already established efforts


